

The association also elected officers for the coming year.


President is Benning Garrison and Ann Fuller is vice president. Margaret Daniel is secretary and Beth Summerville treasurer.





# CENTRAL SAVANNAH RIVER AREA WOMEN'S GOLF ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION

#### Article I

- Section 1: The name of the organization shall be the Central Savannah River Area Women's Golf Association.
- Section 2: The purpose of the organization (hereinafter referred to as the Association) shall be to promote, coordinate and standardize inter-club play among its membership.

#### Article II

- Section 1: Membership in the Association shall be granted to any woman's Golf Association in the CSRA upon application to and approval by the Board of Directors.
- Section 2: Membership shall entitle the member club to participate in all Association events and representation on the Board.
- Section 3: Membership requirements shall be prescribed by the by-laws.

#### Article III

- Section 1: The governing body of the Association shall be the Board of Directors, consisting of a chairman and two representatives from each member club.
- Section 2: From the Board, the officers shall be elected at the first meeting of the year following the Fall Medal Play Tournament.

  They shall be:
  - a. President
  - b. Vice-President
  - c. Secretary-Treasurer
  - d. Tournament Chairman
- Section 3: The duties of the officers shall be described in the by-laws.
- Section 4: Selection of Association representatives shall be left to the discretion of the member clubs.
- Section 5: The CSRA Team Captain shall be elected from among the club team captains at the conclusion of team play schedule.

#### Article IV

- Section 1: The constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the members present at the regular meeting.
- Section 2: The call of the meeting shall include the proposed amendments.

# CENTRAL SAVANNAH RIVER AREA WOMEN'S GOLF ASSOCIATION By-Laws

#### Article I

- Section 1: All member clubs must have an eighteen-hole golf course.
- Section 2: All course ratings and handicaps must be established according to USGA regulations.
- Section 3: The initiation fee shall be \$10.00.

#### Article II

- Section 1: a. The President shall preside at all meetings of the board and the general membership.
  - b. She shall make all committee appointments.
  - c. She shall call meetings as the need arises and advise the secretary to inform all representatives.
- Section 2: The Vice-President shall serve in the absence of the Chairman and as a permanent Chairman for the following year.
- Section 3: a. The Secretary-Treasurer shall handle all correspondence of the Association, record the minutes at all meetings, and send a copy to each representative.
  - b. She shall be the collector and custodian of all Association funds.
  - c. She shall keep a record of all Association receipts and expenditures.

#### Article III

- Section 1: Dues of \$1.00 per year shall be paid on a per capita basis by each member club by September 15, for eighteen-hole golfers
- Section 2: Participation by any player whose Association dues are not paid will be denied.


#### Article IV

- Section 1: The Board shall plan and supervise a 54-hole Medal Play CSRA Championship Tournament. The tournament shall be played in flights without handicap.
- Section 2: The first two rounds qualifying, the third round in flights.

  Section 3: Each round will be played on a different member course, one in Georgia, two in South Carolina, reversing the order the following year.

#### Article V

- Section 1: The by-laws may be amended by a majority vote at any regular meeting provided the amendment was submitted at the previous regular meeting.
- Section 2: a quorum shall be six clubs present.
- Section 3: Each club has one vote.
- Section 4: The Chair has no vote except in case of ties. Section 5: Vote shall be by roll call and general consent.





## The beginning of the CSRA WOMEN'S GOLF ASSOCIATION

Prior to 1961, several clubs in the Central Savannah River Area had hosted Invitational Tournaments at their club; also several teams had played on an irregular schedule basis. Not all area clubs had an established women's golf association. Methods of handicapping and rules for team play differed from club to club. It was most evident that some kind of organization was needed.

On the afternoon of October 24, 1961, the first meeting of the newly organized CSRA (Central Savannah River Area) Women's Golf Association was held at the Augusta Country Club. The organization was composed of two (2) representatives from each of the following clubs-

Highland Park Golf Club - Aiken

Midland Valley Country Club - Aiken

Augusta Country Club - Augusta

Augusta Golf Club - Augusta

Armed Forces Golf Course - Augusta

The purpose of the organization, as stated in the Minutes, was "to establish uniform rules for all participating clubs in regard to handicapping, team play and round robin tournaments."

Those elected to office were:

Abby Montenyohl - President

Helen Taylor - Treasurer

Betty Webb - Secretary

Rhonda Sloan - Team Chairman

Each club was assessed (25¢) twenty-five cents annual dues per member and the organization was to meet only by the call of the president.

Highland Park hosted the second meeting of the organization,
February 8, 1962. It was at this meeting that a 54 hold, 3 day medal
play tournament became an annual event sponsored by this organization.

The organization "caught-on" and in 1962, Green Meadows became a member; '64 Persimmon Hill; '65 North Augusta Country Club; '70 Goshen Plantation, West Lake Country Club and Pine Ridge Country Club; '75 Houndslake Country Club; '78 Belle Meade Country Club. Three clubs, Augusta Golf Club, Armed Forces Golf Course and Persimmon Hill Club withdrew from membership for various reasons. The other 10 clubs, 5 in Georgia and 5 in South Carolina make up the present membership of approximately 350 golfers.

As the Golf Association grew minor changes were necessary but the purpose and general organization have remained the same. Round Robins are played at the member clubs once each month for 7 months and/54 hole, 3 day medal play tournament is played at the 3 remaining clubs in September. Rules of Procedure for tournaments and team play have been revised, refined and made uniform for all member clubs.

Several players clinics and rules seminars have been sponsored by this organization for the benefit of the members.

Abby Montenyohl (Mrs. V.I.) of Aiken, first president of the C.S.R.A. organization, is immediate Past President of the South Carolina State Seniors Organization. Bea Dodson (Mrs. Joe) of Augusta is the current State Seniors Champion of Georgia. Mrs. Dodson is also a past officer and an active member of the CSRA organization from the Green Meadows Club.

A large percentage of the original members still participate in the activities of the organization and serve as representatives to the Board of Directors. The Board continues to be composed of 2 representatives from each member club and the officers of the C.S.R.A. organization.



# Houndslake's new nine holes may attract top tournaments

By Robert Eubanks

"AIKEN - Houndslake Country Club Friday unveiled a new nine-hole section which the club hopes will make it one of the most desired stops on the South Carolina golf

The club already has been scheduled for the annual Women's Carolinas Golf Tournament May 19-22 and junior team matches in June with Florida, Georgia and South Car-

"Houndslake also announced it is inviting the South Carolina Golf Association to hold its 1981 amateur championship here. The tournament setup probably will involve the old back nine, now labeled Dogwood, with the new, called

When the SCGA held its amateur championship here there was the complaint they could hit wedges to every

green.
The tees are longer and the targets more challenging for the better golfer," said architect Joe Lee, who designed the entire 54 holes. "I don't think they'll complain about it being too short, either.

The Laurel nine will play to the traditional par 36 with maximum distance of 3,500 yards and 3,055 yards. The new nine has the same characteristics of the original 18. It has 28 sandtraps and features an 11-acre lake and is being rated by the SCGA. When combined with the Dogwood nine, the course is expected to be in the 72-73 range from the blue

The Dogwood, or former back nine, also is par 36 with maximum of 3,480 and minimum of 3,055. The old front nine, which will be called Azalea, is a par 36 layout which can be stretched from 3,045 yards at the white, or member stees to 3,425 for the blue, or championship, tees.

"You can drive 240 or 245 yards but you had better hit it straight or you'll be reloading," said North Augusta's Happ Lathop, a director of the SCGA. Although the new nine has similar characteristics to the old 18, Lee said "the topography is less harsh becase we had some valleys to work with.

"And we had more opportunity for water that created some stations. It (the reservoir) is man-made but it blended

The reservoir provides a nice test to the elbow or corner of the nine. The second shot on the 580 (510)-yard, par 5 lifth hole, possibly can be handled by some gorilla with

"You possibly can have an opportunity to go for it but you had better have a lot of guts and an extra ball in your pocket," said Lathrop, who's anything but a powderpuff

It rates as the No. 1 handicap hole and although the layup shot is not an extremely long one, placement is impor-tant or else the golfer will be left with a sidehill lie over wa-

No. 6 is a 395 (350)-yard par four with the golfer teeing off over the lake and as Lee noted, allows the golfer to bite off as much "as you feel strong enough to try."

Water guards the right all the way and the green on this,

the No. 4 handicap hole, is on a peninsula.

And No. 7, the No. 2 handicap hole, is a 525 (455)-yard par 5, hole with a left-then-right swing, which will make the golfer breathe a sigh of relief, or say "amen" once he has negotiated the elbow of the Laurel nine

Houndslake's original 18 opened in 1974. Robert E. Penland, who is partner with Robert E. Jones of Denver, Colo., in the venture, said there are plans to lengthen No. 13 of the Dogwood nine but there are no other changes planned. And there are no plans for another nine-hole golf layout.
















## Pine Ridge Golf News


