Female golfers recount history

The best way to silence a group of chatty golfers?

Just call out "Fore!"

That's what worked for Vallusia Houck, 80, whose fairway warning call easily grabbed the attention of about 22 members of the CSRA Women's Golf Association gathered Thursday for a barbecue luncheon at Sconyers to reminisce about old times and old friends.

The purpose of the CSRA Women's Golf Association, formed in 1961, is two-fold, according to member Jan Cross. The association gives female golfers a chance to socialize but also allows them

But, it's the friendships Mrs. Cross, a four-time winner of the association's 54-Hole Championship and past president, enjoys the most.

"I think it's the people and the relationships you build that are most significant," said Mrs. Cross, 59.

Mrs. Houck organized the reunion lunch after seeing golf friends she had lost touch with at a friend's funeral, she said.

"We used to play when it was hot or real cold or when it was raining," said Mrs. Houck, who served as the association's president for four years.

are elderly and unable to play the sport, which is why it's so important to have social gatherings.

Amid wooden tables decorated with Mrs. Houck's homegrown camellias and homemade fudge, the women, ranging in age from 57 to 91, listened as Mrs. Cross thanked them for paving the way for younger female golfers.

"It was not an easy road they took to get us where we are," she said.

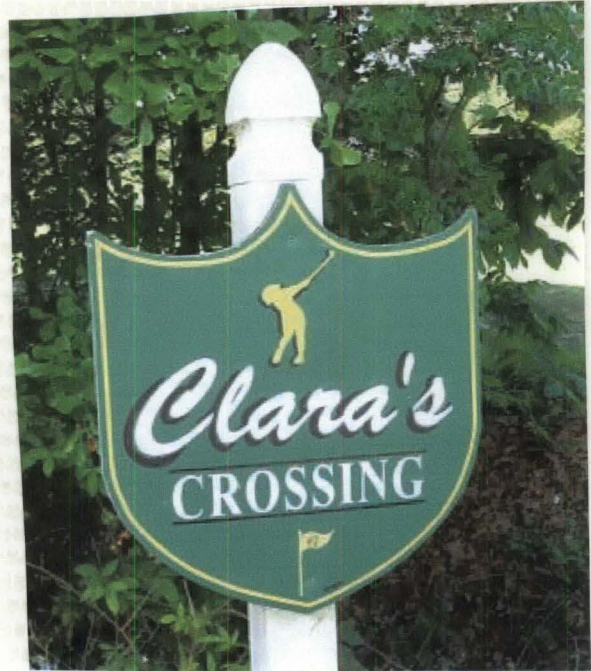

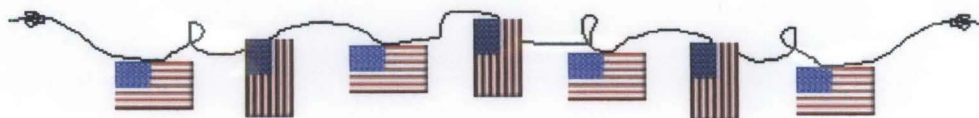

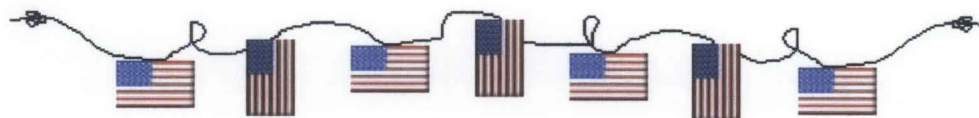

CSRA WGA LADY ~ PRO

June 15, 2006



The purpose of the Lady/Pro tournament is for each CSRA WGA member club to honor its golf professional by inviting him to participate in a special tournament in June at one of the CSRA clubs, where the home foursome competes against foursomes from other CSRA WGA member clubs. The greens fees and luncheon costs for the pros are paid for by the members of his team. Over the years, member clubs have been allowed to submit up to four teams to participate in this event, so the teams have grown to include not only the club's golf professional but some assistant pros, course superintendents, and low-handicap members. 2006 marks the 31st year of this event, which was initiated in 1976 at West Lake Country Club and is hosted this year by West Lake.

Team membership consists of the club professional or another scratch golfer, and an A, B, and C-ranked player who has gained her position on the team through participating in a qualifying round at her home club. The format for the day is two best balls of the team, using the pro's gross score and the best net ball of the A, B, or C players.

There is a luncheon following play, where cash prizes are awarded to the top three winning teams. The prize money is determined by the total amount of the entry fees and is distributed as follows: 50% to the first place team; 35% to the second place team, and 15% to the third place team. A plaque is awarded to the winning team. In addition, the golf pro who shot the lowest gross score for the field receives a trophy and is acknowledged at the luncheon. All winners are acknowledged in the CSRA WGA annual handbook.

Last year's event was held at Mount Vintage Golf Club. The winning team in 2005 was North Augusta's, consisting of Lance Jones and members Cathy McKie, Pam Schmidt, and Barbara Davison. Their winning score was 126. In addition, the low pro for the day last year was Jason Arthur from West Lake, carding a score of 68 on the Mt. Vintage course. CSRA Women's Golf Association tournament underway

The CSRA Women's Golf Association is holding its 44th annual 54-Hole Golf Tournament this week.

The tournament started Monday at Pointe South Golf Club in Augusta, continues today at Palmetto Golf Club in Aiken and concludes Thursday at Woodside Plantation Country Club in Aiken.

This tournament ends the CSRA year and is flighted, but is played without handicaps. There are a record 90 players

in the field and 21 of them are seniors (another record).

Prizes are awarded to the tournament champion, tournament runner-up, each day's medalist and the top three women in each flight. Medalions will be awarded to the 10 women with the lowest tournament scores at the end of three days. In addition, there are senior champion and senior runner-up trophies awarded to the two seniors (65 or older) with the lowest three-day gross scores. The tournament ends

with an awards luncheon on the final day of play.

The CSRA Women's Golf Association had its beginnings in 1961 when several women golfers from various Augusta area golf clubs decided to form a woman's golf organization. The purpose of the organization was to promote further enjoyment of golf by providing a regular schedule of golfing events. That original CSRA board organized the elements of competition that remain in place today: round robins, team play

and a three day championship tournament in the fall.

The first 54-Hole Tournament was held in 1962. The first president of the organization was Abby Montenyohl. There were five founding clubs: Augusta Country Club, Augusta Golf Club, Armed Forces (now Fort Gordon), Highland Park Country Club (now Aiken Golf Club) and Midland Valley Country Club. Dues were 25 cents. Currently, 15 clubs participate. There are 410 CSRA Women's Golf Association

members. Dues are \$5.

Jan Cross was the 2005 54-Hole champion and Liz Scheuer was runner-up. Senior champion was Dee Newberry, while Jan Chuey was the senior runner-up. Cross (four-time champion) will not be defending her title this year due to another commitment. Cathy McKie (three-time champion) will be competing. Newberry will be competing for the senior championship. Newberry has been senior champion since 2001 and was runner-up from 1996-2000.

Lawrette McCann shot a second-round 78 at Palmetto to take a one-shot lead over Cathy McKie at 152, and the two traded places in the first and second-place slots on the leaderboard.

The third and final round will be played tomorrow at Woodside's Cupp Course.

For McCann, playing the historic course was especially

satisfying. "It was such a privilege just to be here, it's a beautiful course, and you feel... steeped in its history," McCann said. "I was lucky to make some putts, and I hit the ball well... I was pleased."

The camaraderie between McCann and playing partners Bonnie McCormick and Debra Hatcher was apparent, and the level of comfort seemed to lift McCann's play.

"We played together yesterday and today, and we've become good friends," McCann said. "Golf will do that, and we all root for each other."

McKie, who shot 73 at the Pointe South Golf Club in Augusta to take the first-round lead, played a consistent round with the exception of a double-bogey on the 17th hole, but gladly took her score on the difficult course.

"The first day was pretty good, but today I didn't putt quite as well," McKie said. "I had one little hiccup... but an 80 on this course, I'll take it."

Golf: McCann leads 54-hole event

The third round promises to be exciting, as McCann is poised to win the tournament on her home course of Woodside Plantation, though she is reluctant to say winning is a sure thing.

"I play that course a lot, but golf is real funny," McCann said. "I'd like to play a good round, and I feel real comfortable at Woodside, but you just never know."

A number of golfers are within 10 strokes of the lead, as

Mary Helen McElreath shot a second-round 80, and sits three strokes back at 155.

Karen Sides, who made a hole-in-one at the 11th, is six strokes back at 158, while Hatcher is eight back at 160 after shooting a second-round 84.

Liz Scheuer and McCormick are at 161 and 162 after shooting 86 and 85, respectively.

"Woodside should be in great shape, as always," McKie said. "We'll see what happens with the other ladies."

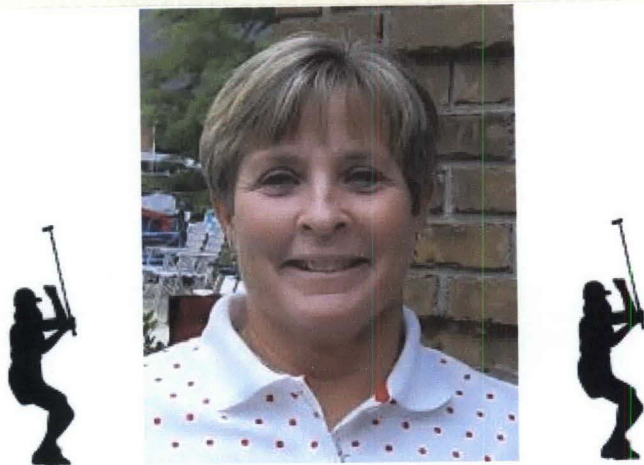

Newcomer takes home win

AIKEN — Lawrette McCann is so new to the area that she'd never seen two of the three courses in this year's CSRA Women's Golf Association's 54-Hole Championship.

No matter, the Aiken golfer dominated the 44-year-old tournament, closing with 5-over-par 77 at Woodside Plantation's Cupp Course on Thursday.

McCann, who moved here with her husband from Akron, Ohio, in April, ended up winning by seven shots over Augusta's Mary Helen McElreath, who had a final-round 81.

McCann, who started on No. 10 Thursday, shot 5-over-par 41 on that side, then came home with even-par 36

on her back nine.

"She got it going on the backside," said McElreath, one of McCann's playing partners.

McCann, a six-handicapper, was the only player in the field to shoot in the 70s all three rounds. She trailed by one shot after an opening 74 at Pointe South Golf Club on Monday, then took a one-shot lead after 78 at Aiken's Palmetto Golf Club on Tuesday before closing with her 77 at Woodside.

The tournament's course rotation also favored McCann. While she had never played Pointe South or Palmetto, she lives on the 16th hole of the Jones Course at Woodside and is a club member. Her best round at the Cupp Course is 73.

"It had to put the advantage in my court, but golf is such a funny thing,"

McCann said. "You never know who is going to show up: The good player that shoots 75 or the rummy player who shoots 85."

McCann is new to the area, but not to golf. She's 60 years old and took lessons from Arnold Palmer's father, Deacon Palmer, when she was 15.

"You can use my age; I'm not one of those women that cares about how old they are," McCann said.

After the victory, McCann feared that some of her fellow competitors wouldn't take to a debut winner, but she was wrong.

"They are so gracious," McCann said. "The people here are wonderful."

Entry Fees

The entry fee for every round robin includes \$1 that goes toward the Memorial Cup fund, \$4 that goes toward that tournament's prizes, the cost of the lunch, and the cost of the cart fees.

Entry fees last year ranged from a low of \$27 to a high of \$42, with an average of \$34.50.
