
feel like a winner.

Fire guts N.A. Golf

NORTH AUGUSTA — A pre-dawn fire ripped through the clubhouse at North Augusta Golf and Country Club Monday, destroying the facility and drawing a five-hour response from seven different fire departments. No one was injured, and the ruins are being investigated as a crime scene, according to a report from the Edgefield County Sheriff's Office.

Robbie Harter, a spokesman for the office, confirmed that his agency had "received information from the responding fire department that they felt the fire was suspicious in nature, due to the way it was burning when they arrived."

Danny Ford, assistant chief of the Belvedere Volunteer Fire Department, said the alarm was sounded between 5:20 and 5:30 a.m. and the blaze was already massive. His agency's chief, Todd Durrance, arrived at the fire within five minutes of the alarm, and found the clubhouse to be "fully involved,"

"When it's fully involved like that, and you've got multiple stories — basements and ceilings and all that — and fire's coming out the roof and windows, we don't send our people in unless there's somebody inside ...

"If we could have got in there and got it and tried to put the fire out, we would have done that, but when we got on the scene, there was absolutely no going inside. Somebody would have got hurt, with the ceilings collapsing on us or something like that. As much as we want to save people's property, we don't want anybody to get hurt."

The Belvedere crew led the attack, not only dealing with high winds but also unusually chilly conditions. Other fire departments at the scene were North Augusta, Merriwether, Bath, Beech Island, Aiken County (Sage Mill) and County Line. An investigator from the State Law Enforcement Division (SLED) arrived at about 11 a.m.

Monday evening, Durrance confirmed that the SLED investigation seemed to indicate the fire began "somewhere in the area of the golf cart and

garage." The investigation, however, was hampered by the ceiling above the garage having collapsed, crushing the carts beneath a thick layer of concrete that would have to be removed in order for the area to be accessible for study, he said

Roy Blackwell, a Merriwether resident, said he arrived "right behind the first fire truck." Referring to the building, he said, "Every bit of it was on fire, from one end to the other ... It was just blazing."

Lt. Tim Pearson, with the North Augusta Department of Public Safety, emphasized that Edgefield County's agencies have jurisdiction in the case, and "are working collaboratively to find out exactly what the cause of the fire is." The North Augusta crew provided manpower and fire apparatus, and the overall response was "another example of agencies from around the area working together," he noted.

The club had been sold recently, with its former tennis pro, Fred Layman, becoming the new owner of the establishment that dates back to 1962. With the facility's purchase from its stockholders, its name was changed from North Augusta Country Club to North Augusta Golf and Country Club.

Layman commented, "We're very sorry for the community's loss. We look forward to rebuilding and making it bigger and better than ever. We're moving fast and furiously. We're going to open up tomorrow (Tuesday) for golfers and tennis players, and we will have a temporary building there by the end of the week, and we're going to meet with the architects to rebuild the clubhouse as soon as possible."

Most of the property (including all of the clubhouse) is in Edgefield County, but a small portion is in Aiken County

— at least part of one fairway.

Ford said investigators "had a pretty good idea," by Monday afternoon, of where the fire started. The apparent area was "down on the bottom side, around where probably the golf carts were kept." The fire seemed to spread up and out from there, but its actual cause had not been determined.

Heather Fulmer, a resident of nearby Maple Drive, recalled the scene from before sunrise, when "we heard the sirens and all, and then we heard walls dropping, and we looked outside and the whole place was just ablaze," she said. "It was really bad."

Donna Johnson, a resident of White Oak Drive, reported that her husband was on his way out the door to work at about 6:30 a.m. and picked up "a handful of palm-sized ashes that had blown into the yard." She pointed out that their house is about a mile and a half from the country club.

The country club's ownership team offered a statement echoing Layman's sentiments on the "extremely unfortunate incident." It noted, "We plan to keep the golf course open and will open the pool as scheduled in mid-May. It is our intention to rebuild the clubhouse where it stood and to continue to honor the history and tradition of our fine club. In the meantime, we plan to establish a temporary golf clubhouse. We will work with those who have scheduled special events at the Club to attempt to minimize the impact of this fire."

It also noted, "We are especially sorry for the Gregory family who founded the Club in 1962 and, like all of us, shared so many fond memories at this facility."

Ford reported Monday after-

noon that the Belvedere fire crews had the scene, but that representatives of SLED and the Edgefield County Sheriff's Office were still there, "They were trying to get in touch with the insurance company and alarm company for information"

The North Augusta Golf and Country Club's founder was the late William Gregory (the namesake of Gregory Lake and its corresponding road). His descendants have had a variety of roles in helping operate the club over the years.

Augusta resident Harold Moon, a longtime club member now serving on the club's board of directors, commented, "I ... have spent many, many years — a delightful time — here, and enjoyed my relationship with all these fine people, and it breaks my heart to see this happen. It's one of those things, and I sincerely hope that it's going to be restored and be a beautiful and lively country club again."

Damage was almost entirely limited to the clubhouse itself, with the fire having reached barely beyond the building, ruining some grass, shrubs and trees but not touching the golf course or any other features of the property. The smoke plume was visible from blocks away and the smell was said to have been evident from more than a mile away.







AIKEN — Mary Helen McElreath didn't have to look far to find motivation Thursday afternoon during the final round of the CSRA Women's Golf Association 54-Hole Tournament and Memorial Cup at The Reserve at Woodside Plantation.

She was surrounded by it.

Playing alongside Lawrette McCann, Elaine Montano and Jan Cross, McElreath was the only player in her foursome that hadn't previously won the championship.

Thanks to three birdies on the back nine Thursday, she beat the group – and joined the group simultaneously – with 3-over-par 75 that gave her a six-shot victory over McCann. McElreath, who was representing Gordon Lakes, finished at 81-73-75-229.

"I was out there playing with three great champions. All we do, in competition, is make each other better," said McElreath, a retired teacher and golf coach at Glenn Hills High.

"When you're competing against the best and you come out with a win, it does make it feel pretty good."

McCann, who moved to the area a year and a half ago from Ohio, won last year's event by beating McElreath. McCann began the final round five shots behind McElreath but closed to within one with an eagle from the fairway at the par-4 10th hole.

"I was pretty excited when I got to within one (after the eagle)," said McCann, whose final-round 76 gave her 235.

and (McElreath) made some birdies, and that was it. I just couldn't putt."
